About Building Bridges through Leadership Training (BBLT)

BYLC's 10-week-long signature leadership training program is designed for H.S.C./Alim/A Level and first and second-year university students, taught all over the country. The BBLT program uses a competitive selection process to enroll students from three different educational systems: English

medium, Bangla medium, and Madrasah. The intensive training program, coupled with an experiential learning model, challenges students to think critically about leadership and apply their skills to effectuate positive change in the society.

About Building Bridges through Leadership Training Junior (BBLTJ)

BYLC's month-long leadership training program is designed for grades 6 to 10 secondary school students. The program, adapted to suit the learning needs of students aged between 12 and 16, focuses on sensitizing a younger audience to the values of leadership, teamwork, community

service, and active citizenship. The program specifically targets students in secondary school to instill positive values during their formative years so that these lessons of leadership and building bridges remain influential throughout their lives.

Key Achievements

Quality & Relevance

- On January 15, 2024, a step-back was taken to set the next steps for the BBLT/BBLTJ program. An internal assessment system is being developed to improve skill indicators, while balancing data collection with reflective leadership learning. The goal is to design data-driven interventions for program effectiveness
- On January 16, 2024, a program intervention was designed to improve the BBLT/BBLTJ program. The curriculum will be revised to include ideological tolerance, moral understanding, and emotional intelligence

Innovation

- Shamresh Saha, Manager, Skills Development Program, attended an international summit on "Stopping Youth Radicalization in the Asia-Pacific Region" organized by Meta, and Search for Common Ground, Colombo, Sri-Lanka. The learning outcomes of the that summit will be incorporated to develop a module that will be integrated into the BBLT/BBLTJ curriculum
- From May to August 2023, the BBLT/BBLTJ program underwent curriculum revision, introducing activity-based learning, website design, Leadership-In-Action, and civic awareness. Timeline were set for each session's activities, emphasizing the significance of experiential learning

Impact & Influence

- In December 2023, Anika Paul shared a testimonial about how the BBLT program positively impacted her life. The program's positive impact on students was understood
- In December 2023, a BBLTJ graduate's parent shared how the LIA intervention helped their child learn about implementing projects for social issues. The program's positive impact on students was understood
- In September 2023, two projects were awarded seed money of BDT 50,000 by BYLC for their potential to develop sustainable solutions for social issues. BYLC will mentor and coordinate with over 20 projects after BBLT/BBLTJ and guide towards developing sustainable social innovation projects



Capacity Building

- In September 2023, the faculty teaching-learning rubric was introduced to guide faculty members towards excellence in their leadership training course preparation and execution. The rubric includes designing time for brief and debrief before class, serving as a reference point for current and future LDT faculties
- On October 15, 2023, the SDP faculty members learned about understanding the BBLT/BBLTJ project overview, designing a learning process, curriculum components, and crafting impactful sessions. They adopted faculty rubrics for preparation and execution
- On September 15, 2023, facilitators learned about resilience, sense of possibility and aligned with the program team goals and vision







Professional Development and Training

BYLC's professional development programs provide training on 21st-century career readiness skills to third and fourth-year university students, postgraduates, and young professionals with less than two years of professional experience. The programs incorporate hands-on training, industry insights, and networking opportunities, providing a holistic approach to prepare participants for successful transitions into the professional world.

About BYLC Development Sector Career Bootcamp

BYLC Development Sector Career Bootcamp is a month-long program to enable participants to gain first-hand knowledge on skills required to enter the Development sector. With sessions by industry experts, the bootcamp focused on technical and soft skills such as adaptability, resilience, management, monitoring and evaluation, and effective communication. Apart from an overview of Bangladesh's Development sector, the bootcamp included sessions on

resume writing, project design and management, project proposal and report writing, data analysis, and efficient communication strategies for development professionals. The bootcamp included a blend of video-based online modules supplemented with instructor-led virtual sessions. Graduates of the program are eligible to avail one-on-one mentoring and counseling sessions from BYLC Office of Professional Development (OPD).



Key Achievements

Quality & Relevance

- 1,700 graduating students across five divisions Dhaka, Chattogram, Mymensingh, Rajshahi, Barisal received training aimed at equipping them with employability skills and empowering them to make informed career decisions
- The program achieved a 90% retention rate, reflecting the high-quality content and learning experience provided to students. BYLC's internal survey also shows that 91% of participants would recommend the training to their peers
- OPD vetted the resumes of 1,000 program participants
- 470 participants benefited from the redesigned career mentoring and mock interview sessions




BYLCX

BYLCx, the online academy of BYLC aims to make leadership and professional development education available for youth anywhere, anytime. Designed in consultation with industry experts, BYLCx courses cover various topics, including communication, critical thinking, professional development, entrepreneurship, and more. Since 2016, BYLCx has produced 69 courses with 1,58,821 course enrollments. To democratize 21st-century

skills and leadership education development, all courses on the platform will be available at no cost for young people aged 18-35. Short and week-long courses on 21st-century soft and technical skills, such as negotiation, creativity, critical thinking, Excel for professionals, etc., are available on BYLCx. BYLCx was featured in the November 2023 issue of the Hundred Spotlight Report.

BYLC Ventures funds promising early-stage founders of Bangladesh to hone their leadership capabilities, strengthen their business acumen, and help validate their big ideas as they transition into investable businesses. Ventures has completed 6 accelerator programs and onboarded 31 startups into its portfolio since 2019. Besides seed funding, BYLC Ventures provides a fully functional co-working space for its portfolio companies. Other services include legal and professional support and customized business training.

Ejaj Ahmad, elected as the new Executive Chairperson of BYLC

On July 30, 2023, the founder of Bangladesh Youth Leadership Center (BYLC), Ejaj Ahmad, was elected as the new Executive Chairperson of the organization at its 14th Annual General Meeting held at BYLC Headquarters in Dhaka.



Agreement signed with Orange Corners

Orange Corners (OC), an initiative of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Netherlands, and BYLC signed an agreement in January 2023 to establish a new OC Hub in Dhaka with assistance from regional partners YY Ventures and SAJIDA Foundation. Through this program, BYLC and Orange Corners aim to provide Bangladeshi youth with the skills, funding, and resources they need to establish successful businesses while enhancing and expanding the entrepreneurial ecosystem.



Started working for USAID BIJOYEE Project

USAID initiated a five-year project in 2023 to empower youth (18-35 years), particularly young women and socially excluded young people. The goal of the project is to ensure that youth have the market ready soft skills and access to relevant technical skills to gain employment or become entrepreneurs. Awarded to CARE Bangladesh and nine local youth organizations including BYLC, the initiative aims to closely work with the government of Bangladesh and private sector entities, to reach over 250,000 youth across urban and semi-urban areas.

Event Highlights

Transforming Bangladesh through Youth Leadership: 14 years of BYLC

On January 5, 2023, BYLC staff, board members, faculty, and alumni came together with dignitaries from government agencies, the private sector, development organizations, educational institutions, and media to celebrate BYLC's 14th foundation anniversary. The event

also saw the release of BYLC Strategy 2023-2027 along with Acts of Leadership: Impact report 2022 that demonstrates how leadership graduates are able to develop and build on different community capitals as a result of participating in BYLC's training programs.



BYLC Graduation Ceremony 2022

More than 500 participants graduated from the Building Bridges through Leadership Training (BBLT) and Building Bridges through Leadership Training Junior (BBLTJ) programs in the year 2022. Two Graduation Ceremonies were organized, one in Chattogram on January 8, 2023 and another in

Dhaka on January 13, 2023 to celebrate these young leaders. The EKN-supported after-school programs provided in-class training on public speaking, problem-solving, communication, and other 21st century skills.

Youth Matters Survey 2023

BYLC and BRAC University's Center for Peace and Justice (CPJ) conducted a countrywide survey, titled Youth Matters Survey 2023, to provide a platform for young people to give their opinion about critical public issues before the National Parliamentary Elections in Bangladesh. From all over the country, 5,609 people participated in this survey. The 'Youth Matters Survey 2023' findings brought up hopes, perspectives, and significant insights for the future of Bangladeshi youth.



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16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence

During the 16 days of activism from November 25 to December 10, 2023, BYLC conducted a three-phase campaign. It began by collecting impactful stories from male and female colleagues who took a stand against violence. In the second phase, BYLC organized a roundtable where staff engaged in a detailed discussion on practical initiatives, mainly concentrating on empowering women and girls. The campaign was concluded by producing a video made from the stories collected.

BYLC Value Awards 2023

Every year BYLC acknowledges its team members with the value award for practicing its six core values.
