# **Editorial**

The Bangladesh Youth Leadership Center (BYLC) conducts the Youth Matters Survey (YMS) every five years near national elections to capture youth perspectives on the country's current state and future aspirations. Traditionally, YMS has amplified youth voices and influenced national reform efforts. Although the last survey was conducted in December 2023, BYLC initiated a new YMS to assess shifts in youth opinions following the country's transformation since July 2024.

The latest findings, reflecting the mindset of motivated youth amid a new government and renewed hope, were unveiled through a press briefing at BYLC Headquarters on January 27, 2025. The Main findings are highlighted in this report.



# Introduction and Objective

# **Background**

The Youth Matters Survey (YMS) 2024 gives youth a platform to voice their concerns and aspirations ahead of elections. With over one-third of the population, youth play a vital role in shaping Bangladesh's future. Rapid socio-economic and political changes since July 2024, including an interim government shift, are influencing their perspectives on education, employment, climate change, governance, and social justice.

# The Objectives of the study for YMS 2024

- To provide youth an opportunity to voice their opinions regarding issues that affect their lives, including the effectiveness of the education system, the impact of climate change, their perceptions of justice and peace, democracy, institutions and governance, migration, and access to information, as well as their outlook on the future of Bangladesh.
- To explore the expectations and desires of the younger generation from the interim government.
- To identify key areas that should be prioritized for restructuring and development as Bangladesh moves forward.

Ensured equal representation (50% male, 50% female)












Do you think that student politics is an obstacle to carrying out educational activities fairly and smoothly in educational institutions?





Which of the following factors have had a negative impact on your physical and mental health? (top 5)









Have you faced any negative effects of climate change in your life?



















# How many times do you believe a candidate should be allowed to serve as Prime Minister at most?




Youth believe a candidate should be allowed to serve as Prime Minister twice at most



# Do you feel confident in the transparency of the upcoming election process?







Which of the following areas should Bangladesh prioritize addressing within the next five years?\*Multiple responses






Do you think peace and justice will improve in Bangladesh in the coming days?






Do you think the situation for girls and women in terms of rights and empowerment will improve in the coming days?





# Religion wise distribution of communal harmony present in Bangladesh in the current situation












Where do you get your information on current events in Bangladesh?






Youth receive information from social media




Youth receive information from various online news portals

# Do you think print media platforms are providing a correct view of current events in Bangladesh?







Youth think social media platforms are providing a correct view of current events in Bangladesh



# How do you feel about the future of Bangladesh?






Youth are positive and hopeful about the future of Bangladesh based on the information they recieve






